Branch 1: Personal Background and Lifestyle

Branch 2: Relationship with Plants and Nature

- 1. Do you have any plants in your home or garden?
 - Yes: What types of plants do you have, and why did you choose them?
 - No: Is there a reason why you haven't chosen to have plants?
- 2. How do you feel about caring for plants?
 - O What do you like or dislike about it?
 - Branching:
 - If they own plants, proceed to Branch 4: Plant Selection Criteria.
 - If they do not own plants, proceed to Branch 5: Retail Gaps and Availability.

Branch 3: Awareness and Education

- 1. How familiar are you with the types of plants that grow in your area?
- 2. How do you usually learn about plants?
 - Online resources, friends, or other sources?
 - Branching:
 - If well-informed, proceed to Branch 4: Plant Selection Criteria.
 - If limited knowledge, proceed to Branch 5: Retail Gaps and Availability.

Branch 4: Plant Selection Criteria

- 1. When selecting plants for your home or garden, what factors do you consider most important?
 - How do you balance practical concerns like maintenance, aesthetics, or environmental considerations when choosing plants?
 - Branching:
 - Proceed to Branch 5: Retail Gaps and Availability.

Branch 5: Retail Gaps and Availability

- 1. Where do you usually buy your plants, and why do you prefer that location?
- 2. How do you feel about the availability and variety of plants in these locations?
 - a. Branching:
 - If there are availability issues, proceed to **Branch 6: Community Influence**.

Branch 6: Community Influence

- 1. Do you talk to friends, family, or community members about your plant choices?
 - o Do they give you advice or recommendations?
- 2. How do community activities (e.g., gardening groups) influence your plant choices?

Branch 7: Regional-Specific Questions Choose questions based on the participant's location.

For Participants from Sweden:

- Do you have any fruit trees or native plants in your garden?
- How do you decide what to grow?
- How do you feel about growing native plants?

For Participants from India:

- What types of plants are easiest to access, and how do you decide which to grow?
- Are you aware of invasive or native plants in your region, and how does that affect your choices?

For Participants from Urban US Cities:

- How do you manage growing plants in an urban environment?
- What challenges or opportunities do you encounter when growing plants in cities like New York or San Francisco?
